

ORDINANCE

An Ordinance Allowing On-Sale Wine License Holders To
Sell Intoxicating Malt Liquors at On-Sale

Morrison County Board of Commissioners hereby ordains:

I. PURPOSE: This Ordinance is intended to limit and control the sale of alcoholic beverages to protect the health and safety of the citizens of the County.

II. AUTHORITY: This Ordinance is enacted pursuant to Minnesota Statute 340A.404 Subd. 5(b).

III. INTOXICATING MALT LIQUOR SALES: A holder of an on-sale wine license issued pursuant to Minnesota Statute 340A.404 Subd. 5(a), who is licensed to sell 3.2% malt liquors at on-sale pursuant to 340A.411, and whose gross receipts are at least 60% attributable to the sale of food, may sell intoxicating malt liquors at on-sale without additional license or fees.

IV. PROCEDURE: Individuals who wish to sell intoxicating malt liquors pursuant to this ordinance must submit annually an affidavit stating that they meet the requirements of this ordinance and other provisions of Minnesota Statute 340A.

V. VIOLATIONS: No individual may sell intoxicating malt liquors at on-sale unless they comply with this Ordinance or other licensing provisions of Minnesota Statute 340A.

VI. PENALTY: Any person violating this Ordinance is guilty of a misdemeanor.
